





- 12.1% corresponding to 32 respondents reported being looking for work, of which **78.1%** are women.
- Lack of experience is the main reason indicated by the people surveyed, as difficulty in finding a job, followed by low level of salary offered.

# **SOME INSIGHTS AND DATA**



It is relevant to highlight that only one person indicates that they are working informally, and that 74.6% of beneficiaries report that their main activity is working. Now, of those who are working, 78.7% make a very positive assessment of the way in which the study has contributed to improving their performance at work.



Some people choose to train in unconventional programs, many of which are part of the 4.0 industry, for example: Technology in multimedia production, Technology in management and creative production for visual practices. Technology in music information, among others. In this way, an intersection is being created between the offer of this type of programs and the demand that they have on the inhabitants of the district
