Changes generated in people's lives after carrying out higher education studies, with resources from the P.P. Fund delivered by Sapiencia.

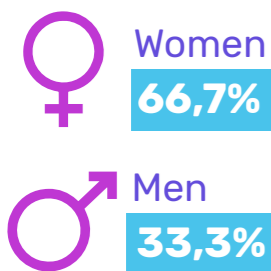

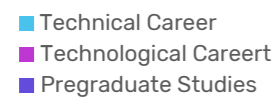

## TOP 10 careers chosen by the beneficiaries

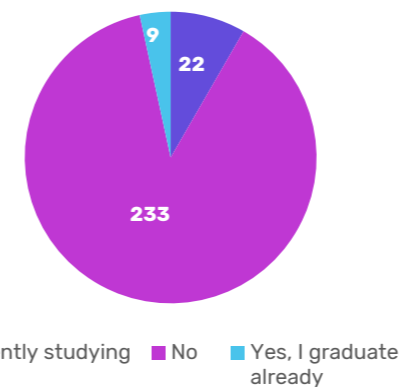

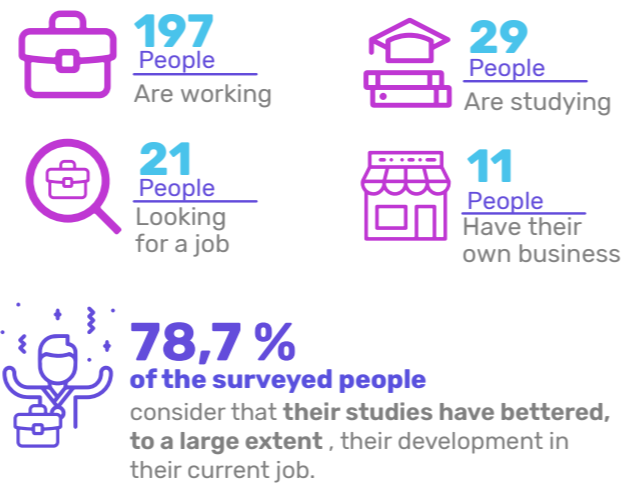

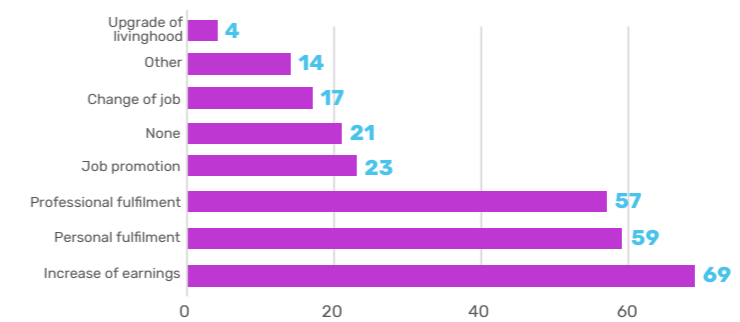
## Out of the people that are currently working

- 97,5% consider that their current job is contributing to their development and personal growth.
- 69% of the beneficiaries are very satisfied with the work they do.
- 75,6% of the beneficiaries consider that the most appropriate level of training for the work activity carried out is a college major and technical or technological careers.

## Out of the people that are looking for a job

- 12,1% corresponding to 32 respondents reported being looking for work, of which 78,1% are women.
- Lack of experience is the main reason indicated by the people surveyed, as difficulty in finding a job, followed by low level of salary offered.

## Main positive change after finishing their college studies



58% Women, 64,8% Men say they totally agree that studying higher education has opened up new job opportunities for them.

56,1% of people point out that their economic conditions have improved thanks to their studies.

97,7% consider the support of the Fund helpful to better their and their families quality of life.  
63% of the people are the first person of their family that has a college major.  
97,5% consider that their current job is contributing to their development and personal growth.

## SOME INSIGHTS AND DATA

It is relevant to highlight that only one person indicates that they are working informally, and that 74.6% of beneficiaries report that their main activity is working. Now, of those who are working, 78.7% make a very positive assessment of the way in which the study has contributed to improving their performance at work.

Some people choose to train in unconventional programs, many of which are part of the 4.0 industry, for example: Technology in multimedia production, Technology in management and creative production for visual practices, Technology in music information, among others. In this way, an intersection is being created between the offer of this type of programs and the demand that they have on the inhabitants of the district.

## Out of the beneficiaries



**The three HEIs in the district** (Colegio Mayor, ITM and Pascual Bravo) are among the top six places in preference of the people surveyed to carry out their undergraduate studies.
